Voting Rights Organizations

Below is a list of Voting Rights Organizations listed in alphabetical order. In addition to a description of each group, every listing provides a way that you can "take action" and volunteer to register voters, protect voting rights, and educate voters. It is not enough just to vote, we must ensure that all Americans who want to vote can do so this November.

American Civil Liberties Union

The ACLU is engaged in advocacy and litigation across the country to get rid of harmful voter suppression measures once and for all.

The Brennan Center works to make voting free, fair, and easy. Their reforms are modernizing American elections, starting with automatic voter registration and measures to ensure election security. And they fight restrictive voting policies that make it harder to vote.

Election Protection

The national, nonpartisan Election Protection coalition works year-round to ensure that all voters have an equal opportunity to vote and have that vote count. Made up of more than 100 local, state and national partners, Election Protection uses a wide range of tools and activities to protect, advance and defend the right to vote.

Election Protection provides Americans from coast to coast with comprehensive information and assistance at all stages of voting – from registration, to absentee and early voting, to casting a vote at the polls, to overcoming obstacles to their participation.

Action

- Volunteers provide voter information, document problems they encounter when voting and work with partners and volunteers on the ground to identify and remove barriers to voting. Election Protection focuses on the voter—not on the political horse race—and provides guidance, information and help to any American, regardless of his or her voting choices.
- Voter Assistant Call Centers -- Support voters by answering their questions, helping them navigate the voting process, and responding to reports of problems.
- Field Programs at the Polls --In select locations, volunteers go to the polls to answer voter questions in person and respond to any voting issues that arise.

iVote

iVote was created in 2014 with one goal: secure voting rights for all Americans. iVote focuses on two vehicles to go on offense for voting rights: Electing Democratic voting rights champions as secretary of state and passing automatic voter registration in states across the country.

Action

Power The Polls

Power the Polls is a first-of-its-kind initiative to recruit poll workers to ensure a safe, fair election for all voters. Most poll workers are over the age of 60 and, in the era of uncertainty caused by the coronavirus, fewer are signing up for the job. The consequences have already been felt in several recent primaries, where poll worker shortages led to long lines and voter disenfranchisement.

Power the Polls will be a part of the solution by addressing the need for healthy and diverse poll workers who can staff in-person voting locations during early voting and on Election Day.

- Sign up to be a poll worker in your community. Qualifications vary by jurisdiction. Many states require poll workers to be registered to vote in the state or their local jurisdiction. In some cases, younger people who aren't yet eligible to vote can also serve as poll workers.
- Contact your local election office to find out the requirements and to sign up to be an election worker.

When We All Vote is a non-profit, nonpartisan organization that is on a mission to increase participation in every election and close the race and age voting gap by changing the culture around voting, harnessing grassroots energy, and through strategic partnerships to reach every American. Launched in 2018 by co-chairs Michelle Obama, Tom Hanks, Lin-Manuel Miranda, Janelle Monae, Chris Paul, Faith Hill and Tim McGraw, When We All Vote is changing the culture around voting using a data-driven and multifaceted approach to increase participation in elections. In the months directly before the 2018 midterm elections, When We All Vote organized 2,500 local voter registration events across the country, engaged 200 million Americans online about the significance of voting, and texted nearly four million voters the resources to register and get out to vote.
